Bradley Graham began his law enforcement career in 1987 as a Police Officer for the Santa Ana (CA) Police Department. In 1989, he became a Patrol Officer for the Tacoma (WA) Police Department where he remained until 2018. In 1994, he was promoted to Detective where he served in the Domestic Violence, Special Assaults, and Homicide Units.
